Vision and Purpose

Curtin University and the RRR Network of WA have been funded by the Australian Government and the National Careers Institute to strengthen career pathways of rural, regional, and remote Western Australian women

This short course will equip rural, regional and remote (RRR) women with the required capabilities and knowledge to take ownership of their careers as a pathway to long and short term career sustainability and economic independence.

A team of experts from academia, industry and local community groups will facilitate a series of targeted workshops to maximise participant learning outcomes, career and life management skills.

Industry mentoring, peer-mentoring and facilitation of a community of practice will ensure long term sustainability as a viable



platform and toolkit for locally informed career guidance, collaboration and support.

This world-leading program is fully-funded for RRR participants via the Australian Careers Institute, Curtin University and the RRR Network.
