Our Social Impact

- Today, we have 8 Board Members, 11 Regional Ambassadors, 2 Staff, 300 Members and 15,200 followers.
- 117 women have been on the Board/Reference Group since 1996.
- Since 2019, over 500 women have accessed RRR Network professional development.
- The RRR Network has published several research reports from Sexual Harassment, Leadership and Understanding the Key Issues for RRR women.


The RRR Network was founded because RRR women sought visibility, connection, and opportunity to participate in key decision making and the workplace.
