The RRR Network is the peak women's body in Western Australia (WA) advocating for rural, regional, and remote women, and regional liveability. Our purpose is to connect and empower women to build strong communities and improve liveability in rural, regional and remote Western Australia.

**Mission:** Connect and empower rural, regional, and remote women to lead, influence and build stronger communities through advocacy, collaboration and action.

**Vision:** Women in rural, regional, and remote WA are central to leading positive change and building thriving, inclusive communities.

## What we do.

- Promote the value of regional communities and the vital resources they provide as essential to the long-term social, cultural, economic, and environmental sustainability of WA.
- Foster relationships with and between RRR members, regional industries and communities, corporate, education and research partners, and government and decision makers.
- Champion initiatives that support women-led businesses, social enterprises and community groups to grow, thrive and stay in regional WA.
- Activate mutually beneficial partnerships and collective action to amplify the priorities of RRR women.
- Provide and create pathways for personal and professional development, leadership opportunities, mentorship and education for RRR women.
- Create and promote opportunities to showcase, engage and connect RRR women through collaborative media and events.
- Influence government policy, shape decision making and drive systemic change.
- Gather data, insights and lived experiences of RRR women on what matters to them and their communities.



## Our Social Impact

- Today, we have 8 Board Members, 11 Regional Ambassadors, 2 Staff, 300 Members and 18,000 followers.
- 117 women have been on the Board/Reference Group since 1996.
- Since 2019, over 500 women have accessed RRR Network professional development.
- The RRR Network has published several research reports from Sexual Harassment, Leadership and Understanding the Key Issues for RRR women.

**2026 marks the RRR Network's 30 year anniversary, highlighting our strong reputation and trust as a not for profit in making a positive difference to the lives of Western Australian RRR women and community.**

The RRR Network was founded because RRR women sought visibility, connection, and opportunity to participate in key decision making and the workplace.

Today, there are approx. 217,000 women aged from 15-64 living in a WA RRR location and their lived experience remains challenging - from accessing essential services, education and employment.

We are committed to reducing the impact of these issues by working collaboratively with our partners.

## An investment that makes a difference.

An independent ACIL Allen report found that the RRR Network generated \$734,680 in quantifiable benefits in 2024–25. These benefits included education and training events, networking opportunities, expanded social media reach, reduced social isolation, and the attraction of partnerships and volunteer support.

The report also confirmed a benefit–cost ratio of 2.2, demonstrating that the benefits of the RRR Network significantly outweigh the cost of funding it. In practical terms, for every dollar invested, the RRR Network delivers \$2.20 in benefits, with the majority flowing directly into the economies and communities of rural, regional and remote Western Australia.
